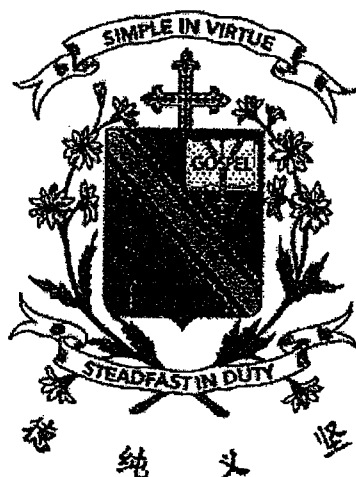

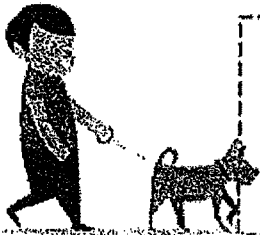
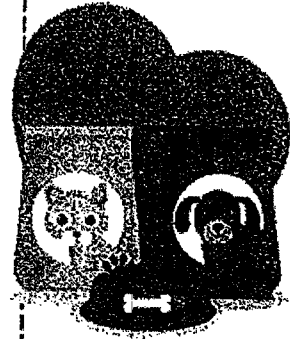

- Table scraps should not be given as they can make your pet sick or can even be fatal.

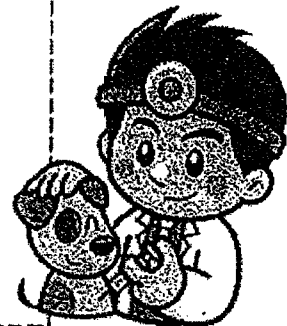


Regular exercise

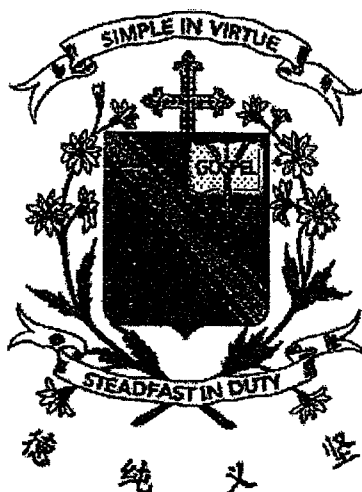

I had spent most of my life making cautious, predictable choices. I wanted to change that. Last year, I decided that I would challenge myself in a way I had never done before. I made up my mind to climb Mount Meru.

It was a dark, cold night on the fourth day of the climb. I was about to collapse from exhaustion. Accompanied only by a guide named Moses, I was taking on the toughest part of Mount Meru – the steep hike to the mountain top. Moses grew up in the mountains, so he was used to the height. I, on the other hand, struggled to keep up with him. We had to make it to the top and come back down, all before noon the next day. "The ice caps will be melted by the noon sun," Moses warned me. "That is when *avalanches happen."

I was wearing a headlamp. It was of little use as the only things visible were bits of the rocky As Moses took a sudden turn to the left, I tried to follow suit. To my horror, my feet slid a few inches, and I was sure that I would tumble down the mountainside. I panicked. Moses helped me to a safe spot. "You're tired. Take a rest." As I gasped for breath, I felt faint because of the lack of oxygen in the air.

After catching my breath, we continued our ascent. In the hours that followed, we experienced extreme weather conditions. I could not hear anything but the howling wind. I could not feel anything, but the I was in despair. I had done a lot of reading on Mount Meru prior to the trip, but nothing could have prepared me for the experience.

Moments later, I stumbled and fell onto my knees a second time. I realised I was not going to make it. "Would that really be shameful if I turned back now?" I wondered. Before this, I had met several at the base camps. They told me they had to the mountain top. "Such all the time," I tried to console myself.

"Wait. Stop!" I called out to Moses. When he looked back and saw me, there was concern in his eyes. "Moses, I'm sorry but..." I trailed off, panting as I got up. I did not want to quit, but I felt too weak to go on. As I debated how to express this to him, the line from an old song popped into my head. The lyrics reminded me that when fear becomes overpowering, I need to rely on God's strength. I felt a surge of energy course through my body. "Give me a moment," I informed Moses. I reached into my bag and took out a chocolate bar. While devouring it and singing the inspirational song, I knew I could reach the top.

As we pressed on, the sun appeared over the horizon. I gasped at the beautiful sight. A sign on top of the mountain said: "Congratulations, you are at the top of Mount Meru." This would not have been possible had I not persevered. My heart sang with joy.
